

IMPACT ON CHILDBIRTHS

50% of births in Arizona are financed by Medicaid/AHCCS

The average cost of childbirth in Arizona without insurance is \$15,634

Medicaid/AHCCCS also covers:

- Prenatal care and regular check-ups
- Newborn care and immunizations
- Pediatrician visits and screenings




MPACTON ELDER CARE

Medicaid covers premiums for 1 in 6 Medicare enrollees.

Arizona's Long Term Care System, funded by Medicaid/AHCCCS, is designed to help individuals maintain their independence and stay in their homes rather than needing to move to a facility.

What would you do if you or your loved one could not access this service? Where would you go?

This puts more pressure on loved ones to provide care and on Nursing Home capacity.



IMPACT ON DRUG COSTS

Prescription drug coverage is an optional benefit under federal Medicaid law, so it may be the first thing to get cut.

Prescription drug costs are rising.

Net Medicaid spending (after rebates) on prescriptions increased by an estimated 72% from 2017 to 2023, from \$30 billion to \$51 billion.

In 2017, 26 percent of Arizona residents reported that they stopped taking a medication as prescribed due to cost.



Lessons Learned from Prior Funding Cuts to Medicaid:

- People delayed care for minor, preventable health issues until they became emergencies, making emergency rooms way busier.
- Wait times increased for everyone due to cuts in services and staffing.
- Hospitals barely survived without reliable sources of payment.
- Healthcare providers raised prices for care to recoup their losses.
- Costs to small businesses and other employers went up.
- Arizona businesses became less competitive as costly health benefits made it challenging to attract and retain workers.

EVEN WORSE FOR RURAL HOSPITALS



Nine rural hospitals in Arizona are already in danger of closing because of financial reasons.

1 in 3 Arizonans living in rural areas have health coverage through AHCCCS.




